Guidelines for Assisted, Residential and Independent Living Apartments

- Please ask your visitors check in at the Swiss Village Front Desk kiosk before each visit. Visitors may check in anytime between 7:30 a.m. – 7:30 p.m. daily.
- You are welcome to have visitors in your apartment. We ask that you refrain from visiting in our lounges and public spaces.
- At this time, overnight guests are not permitted in licensed areas. However, residents in Independent Living may have overnight guests.
- Currently, we are not able to have guests eat in the dining room or café. You may dine with your guests in a private setting, and items may be purchased in the café to go.
- Masks are not required in designated independent living areas (ie: Zurich, Lucerne, Basel, Zermatt). However, we ask that anyone who enters the main part of the building to wear a mask. Masks are required due to our licensure status.
