RE: Update to yesterday's numbers

DATE: Sunday, November 8, 2020

Good morning. I hope this day of rest and worship finds you well. I am providing a final update from this week's testing results. Unfortunately, as the results kept coming in yesterday after releasing the morning memo, the positive case count kept creeping up as well. By the end of the day we had an additional 9 positive residents. All positive residents were quickly moved (16 of them) to one of our two "Hot Zone" wings where they will now settle in for a ten-day period. (**Thank you** to the great team of folks who came in to help accomplish this tremendous fete!) We also were able to move a couple of residents back off of those wings to their normal residence as their cases had not increased and they had exhausted their ten-day period. We are expecting to move a few others off of the Westenfeld wing by tomorrow. Fortunately, with just a few exceptions, all cases of our positive residents (and employees for that matter) have not developed into major sickness issues at all, and many have been totally asymptomatic. As a matter of fact, several of our residents, yesterday, simply refused to believe that they were even sick at all and were surprised by the news of the need to temporarily relocate. Please continue to pray for our residents and employees who are currently dealing with this positive test result and that their cases remain minimal to nil in symptoms and signs

As to our running total now for today, we are reporting 50 residents, 43 employees, and 6 contract employees since the start of the pandemic period in March. We also have had 5 residents pass who had also been confirmed as COVID-19 positive. We continue to pray for the families, loved ones and friends of our lost souls as they continue to mourn their losses at this most difficult time.

I will stop there for today. Please know that we are doing our very best to keep this bug contained within the Nursing Facility and we are taking every step and measure to reduce its unrelenting spread within that area. This is all the more reason that it is so very important for you to continue to treat this situation seriously, to practice the good hygienic actions that we speak of so often, social distance, masks, wash hands often, don't touch face/eyes/mouth/nose. And please continue to be patient with us as we continue to deploy our protective measures.
